In spoken English, words in a sentence are not all stressed in the same way. We usually stress the **content words** (words that have meanings) and reduce **function words** (grammar words).

Content words are nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, negative auxiliaries, question words, demonstratives and not.

Function words are articles, prepositions, conjunctions, pronouns, auxiliaries, and modals.
